

"Lone Wolf" Prohibition Freed of Murder Charge

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 23.—By A. P.—James L. Asher, prohibition agent, known as the "Lone Wolf," was acquitted by a jury in the federal district court tonight of charges of second degree murder and manslaughter, in connection with the death of Peter Yancauskas, a saloon keeper. The jury returned a verdict of not guilty after deliberating about five hours.
