

"LONE WOLF" ASHER HELD IN DEATH QUERY

Philadelphia, July 2. — James L. Asher, federal prohibition agent, to whom the name "Lone Wolf" was often applied in his solitary investigations of liquor violatons in Washtoday in \$5,000 bail at an inquest into today in \$5,000 bail at an inquest into the death of a saloonkeeper. Asher was first held for trial without bail by Coroner Knight, but \$5,000 was later fixed as bond after arrangements had been made with the district attorney's office.

During a raid led by the "Lone Wolf" on a cider saloon August 27, 1922, a fight occurred. It was charged that Asher kicked Peter Yancauskas, the saloonkeeper, in the stomach and caused injuries from which the latter died June 11. Irvin Jenkins, at witness at the inquest, testified that the kick was administered by Asher while the saloonkeeper was lying on the floor.

Counsel for Asher attempted to show that the prohibition laws were being violated, but Coroner Knight refused to allow this testimony.
